#### **Historical/Biographical Notes**

A series of programs entitled "Wednesday Mornings at the Library" was offered during 1979. At the program held May 9, 1979, six speakers talked about six of the historic public buildings around the center of Lincoln: Stone Church, Town Hall (now Bemis Hall), Library, White Church, Center School (now Town Offices), and the 'Store' (Old Town Hall). The speakers were tape recorded, and transcriptions of the tapes are the bulk of this collection. The original tapes have not been found.

#### **Scope and Content**

The collection comprises transcriptions of six speakers about six of the historic public buildings in the center of Lincoln. In addition, there are comments about the physical characteristics of Lincoln around 1900, and a brief biographical sketch of Malcolm Donaldson who opened and closed the program and gave the introductory talk. There are also notes about the program and about the transcriptions.

The collection is arranged topically.
